 - Counselling for 20,000 earthquake survivors
 - Training out-of-college graduates in mental health care

HOW TROCAIRE IS HELPING HAITI RECOVER

Making a real difference in Haiti

On January 12, 2010, Haiti, one of the poorest countries in the world, was ripped apart by an earthquake. In less than one minute, up to 300,000 people were killed and 1.3 million people were left homeless.

The Irish people responded to this disaster by donating a staggering €7.58m to Trócaire. In the immediate aftermath of the earthquake, Trócaire, alongside the global Caritas humanitarian network, provided shelter to 160,000 people, healthcare to one million people and food to over one and a half million people.

Our work continues in Haiti and we are ensuring that every cent donated goes directly to helping those worst affected by the devastating earthquake.

Recovery work in Haiti has not been easy due to a number of factors, including Hurricane Tomas, an outbreak of cholera, poor governance and an infrastructure which was already extremely poor prior to the earthquake.

However, your donations are making a real difference.

Trócaire is bringing sanitation, clean water, education and healthcare to some of the poorest people in Haiti. Our work is saving lives and bringing hope to a country which has been decimated.

Haiti has an opportunity to make a fresh start. The international community has pledged billions in support. This money must be used to build a society free from the appalling and truly shocking levels of poverty that have characterised Haiti for decades.

Trócaire is working with local and international partners to deliver real change in Haiti.
