




CACTON OF AIR Zimbabweans live below the poverty line

In Southern Zimbabwe, people continue to face more frequent and more severe droughts. This, along with the devastating drought of 2016 has left this part of the country reeling, with rural Zimbabweans feeling the presence of poverty and food scarcity the most acutely.

Rural women are particularly affected as they are responsible for 80% of agriculture production. Most families can only produce enough food for their families for 7 months of the year – the remaining 5 months are known as the **hungry months**.

# THE 5 HUNGRY MONTHS OF DROUGHT DEPRIVES THE RURAL POOR OF FOOD, OF ANIMALS, OF INCOME AND CHILDREN ARE DROPPING OUT OF SCHOOL WITH MALNUTRITION.

- 62% of all Zimbabweans live below the poverty line – This figure is much higher in the rural areas of the south where Trócaire works (Up to 90% in some areas).
- 70% of Zimbabwe's poor and vulnerable live in the rural areas. Lack of access to clean water means families have to resort to using dirty water, leading to spread of disease particularly in the young and elderly.
- 4 million people are now struggling to meet basic food needs as a result of the second most recent drought to hit this area.
- Rural Women are particularly affected as they are responsible for approximately
   80% of agricultural production on their homesteads.

To raise €160,000 over the next three years for drought stricken Matebeland and Masvingo in Southern Zimbabwe to provide:



## Trócaire's Work in Zimbabwe


### WHERE
