




Lenten Resource Pack

Since 2015, thousands of educators in Ireland have used Trócaire’s Lenten Resource packs to explore the subject of climate change and climate justice with their students.

We know that climate change is unjust. The people who are doing least to cause it are suffering the most and those with most power to address it have so far failed us. It doesn’t have to be this way. An active, educational response to climate change can help steer us towards a positive future for all.

This response becomes especially urgent when we reflect on the fact that our students are inheriting the global challenge of climate change – from us. Yet, children and young people possess the creative power to take action and develop innovative solutions to climate change. Our Lenten packs are intended to grow this potential and encourage students to develop their own solutions, while exploring the experiences of their peers in Honduras, Kenya and Ethiopia.

Creating Futures

This is a climate change education resource for senior primary classrooms, consisting of ten lessons to inspire enquiry, creativity and cooperation. Resources are cross-curricular and include lesson plans, activities, worksheets, photographs, web links and lots more. This resource was created as a joint initiative between Trócaire and St Patrick's College, DCU.



Tales of Disasters

This includes a DVD and accompanying booklet. The DVD contains four short puppet films to teach children about floods and landslides, earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanoes. An additional film, entitled *Two Gardens* explores how outsiders are welcomed into communities. The booklet explores how the DVD can be used in the classroom and includes questions based on each film, activities, case studies and worksheets, all specifically linked to the Primary Curriculum.



Trócaire Better World Award

This is an award that recognises the work and learning that takes place each year while exploring Trócaire's Lenten theme from February to April. As the Lenten stories and activities are explored with the pupils, work is recorded in the form of artwork, letters, crafts, photos or through drama performances, then entered into the Trócaire Better World Award. Participants who submit an entry receive a Trócaire Better World Award certificate and badge, and the top nine entries will receive prestigious sculptures.
