

# Did you know that Trócaire works with people in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Middle East?

**PETERS WORLD MAP**  
 The map which represents countries accurately according to their surface area.  
 AREA SCALE 1:1,200,000,000 VOLLION  
 One centimetre on the map = 120 kilometres on the ground.  
 THE MAP SHOWS COUNTRIES IN PROPORTION TO THEIR ACTUAL SURFACE AREA AND PRESERVES SHAPES AND ANGLES. THE SURFACE OF THE EARTH IS NOT FLAT BUT CURVED AND THEREFORE THE USE OF EQUAL HORIZONTAL LINES IN THE MAP WOULD BE UNDESIRABLE. THE OTHER RECTANGLES SHOWN THESE BE PROPORTION TO THE LENGTHS THEY REPRESENT. THE CORRECT MEASUREMENT OF THE SYSTEM IS COMPADED WITH A PROPOSED MEASUREMENT. EQUAL AREA MAPS ARE NOT PERFECT BUT THE DISTORTION OF THE RECTANGULAR MAPS ON THE GLOBE AND THE PRESENT MAPLINE IS INDICATED WITH A DOTTED LINE.




## Seed-Mothers


