THE TIME FOR WOMEN IS NOW

Nowhere in the world do girls and women have the same opportunities as men. But the social, cultural and economic barriers to equality are even higher for women experiencing extreme poverty.

We live in a world in which women living in poverty face gross inequalities and injustice from birth to death. From lack of access to education and malnutrition to forced marriage, low-paid employment and gender-based violence, the sequence of discrimination that a woman may suffer during her lifetime is all too common.

This discrimination traps women and girls in poverty and it is unacceptable.

In the 17 countries that we work, and in particular Rwanda, Malawi, Nicaragua and the DRC, women are denied a voice in the decisions that affect their lives. Not only does this threaten their physical safety, it also limits their ability to learn, develop and lead their lives to the fullest of their potential.

This can change. But only if together we invest in women and their power.

OUR APPROACH TO WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT

Trócaire supports women to have a voice and to be able to make informed decisions that affect their lives.

Our women's empowerment programme is based on an integrated and sustainable approach that works at many levels.

- With individual women: We build confidence and self esteem, increasing knowledge and skills. We provide safe access to water sources.
- Within households: We work towards shared decision making within the household, promoting shared control of household income.
- Within communities: We build positive attitudes for gender equality weaving it into the fabric of communities.
- Wider society and institutions: We address power imbalances. We challenge political and economic structures. We influence laws and policies.

Our actions include:

- Legal aid to women victims of violence.
- Creating community structure and groups and promoting leadership and participation from women.
- Educating women on their rights.
- Bring together key institutions to tackle prevention of gender based violence e.g. schools, church and police.

- Provide literacy training for women and girls.
- Establish women's groups to encourage confidence.
- Work with men and boys to educate and challenge attitudes to women.
- Support survivors of abuse, rape and violence with medical, psychological, social, legal and financial support.

THE DAUGHTER FUND: ONE WOMAN IS WHERE CHANGE BEGINS

In rural Rwanda, Esperance's life has been transformed by improved access to water and a flourishing kitchen garden.

Rwanda is one of the most densely populated countries in Africa, and access to water is a major obstacle. But in the village of Gikonero, the community has implemented a strikingly effective solution.

With the help of Trócaire partner IPFG, the community has built tanks to harvest rainwater from the roofs of houses. These water tanks make it possible for community members to water the kitchen gardens they have built outside their homes.

The committee supports survivors of sexual and gender-based violence, providing psycho-social support as well as assistance seeking medical and legal support. Cases of sexual violence are incredibly common in this region and many perpetrators are never brought to justice.



Vestine Uwizeyinana and Claudine Tuyishimire sort grain at Muhanga Food Processing Industries which started as a co-op of 77 women farmers in 1994, following the genocide in Rwanda. Being a member of the co-op meant farmers could produce in bulk and secure a better price for their produce. Today, 80% of the shareholders of this plant are women.

STRENGTHENING WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP

You can support women having a voice and making informed decisions that affect their lives through leadership and mentoring programmes. The first step is creating an environment where women can develop and grow in confidence and safety. By coming together in groups, women can share experiences, elect leaders, prioritize needs and make change happen themselves. The initial framework provided around these programmes is essential for their sustainability and success.

£10,000

will provide mentoring, advocacy and leadership courses to be set up within 3 communities, bringing about change in attitudes for both men and women by focusing on women's leadership potential.



PROVIDING LEGAL AID

You can help women challenge their abusers legally and help us advocate for laws that protect women and respect their rights and dignity. €20,000

will provide legal aid for up to 100 women, so survivors of violence and abuse can seek justice with dignity.



ACCESS TO WATER AND SEEDS

You can provide access to fresh water which is critical for protecting women's health and possible income generation. Access to clean water in a community leads to better hygiene, opportunity to grow crops and earn income, improved nutrition and safety for women and girls when collecting water.

£50,000

will provide 120 water storage tanks or rainwater harvesting units, allowing women to farm more productively, improve family nutrition and earn an income.



SUPPORTING SMALL BUSINESS EDUCATION

You can provide life changing education to women and girls so they can learn new income generation skills, business education, help with setting up small business, microfinancing and support with access to markets.

£100,000

will provide training for 100 girls and young women in technical vocational schools, to learn new skills and receive support to set up their own small businesses and earn their own income.
